JOB SUMMARY

Reporting to the Chief Engineer, this position performs maintenance on our vessel relative to electrical and electronic equipment and control systems ensuring all electrical and electronic machinery and systems are operating smoothly by performing both preventive and corrective maintenance.

Duties & Responsibilities:

- Ensure all electrical and electronic machinery and systems are operating smoothly by performing preventive and corrective maintenance on a daily basis.
- Repair or replace wiring, equipment or fixtures as required
- Examine electrical wiring, equipment, or fixtures, using testing devices like ohmmeters, voltmeters, or oscilloscopes.
- Troubleshoot faulty systems or parts, using equipment and tools to find the reason for a breakdown.
- Inspect electrical systems, equipment, or parts to spot hazards or defects.
- Prepare sketches or follow blueprints to see the placement of wiring or equipment.
- Work on the installation of ground leads and connect power cables to equipment
- Perform routine and annual maintenance
- Assist other shipboard departments as required. (IT, galley equipment etc.)
- Maintain the applicable sections of the engine room logbook and work book as necessary
- Keeps applicable work areas tidy
- Performs other related duties as directed by Second or Chief Engineer.

WORK SCHEDULE

This position seasonal beginning approximately mid-May and ending approximately mid-December. It is rotation-based flying in/out of Happy Valley-Goose Bay.

The Electrician works 12 hours per day of varied hours on an approximate 6-8 week duration with 4 weeks relief. From mid-November onward, the Electrician may be required to remain onboard the vessel until the end of the season.
